



Mount Baruntse(7129m)



Introduction

Baruntse (7129m/23,389ft) peak is located very close to Mount Everest and Mount Makalu. Baruntse expedition is a month long adventure and an extraordinarily aesthetic objective for peak climbing in Nepal. Baruntse first became famous when a New Zealand expedition including Colin Todd and Geoff Harrow summited the peak on May 30, 1954 via the Southeast Ridge. For the remote and isolated trekking experience this peak location is considered as wise choice.

Mount Baruntse is at the height of 7,129m. in between the lap of Everest and Makalu mountain. This mountain was first ascended first by Colin Todd and Geoff Harrow on 30 May 1954. They have climbed the mountain by the South -East Ridge. Since then many climbers have used this route and got succeeded. This mountain has also been becoming coveted day by day like the other Pumori, Ama Dablam as well as Everest too. The south -East Ridge of Baruntse it is little bit difficult because of being straightforward hard ways to climb. There are hard sections of 50 Degrees elevation with a prominent ice cliff to be climbed facing the risk of avalanche. The climbers have succeeded the mountain mostly in the spring season because of being the season the best to the climber safety. But also some climbers have reached on it's top in the autumn season as well.

- **Day 1** : Arrive at Tribhuvan International Airport (KTM) Kathmandu:

- **Day 4** : Trek from Lukla to Chutanga(3050m/10,006ft) 4hrs. Lodge accommodation. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 5** : rek from Chutanga to Thuli Kharka (Chatra-La) (3900m/12,597ft) 7hrs.Trek over the Zatrwa La Pass (4610m/15,125ft.) and down climb to Khartitang at (3900m). Overnight accommodation at tea house. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 6** : Trek from Tuli Kharka to Kothe (4095m/13,435ft) 5 hrs. Tea house accommodation. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 7** : Trek from Kothe to Thangnak (4350m/14,272ft) 4 hrs. You will enjoy fantastic views of the South face of Mera peak throughout the day. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 8** : Rest and acclimatization day at Thangnak(4,350m/14,272ft). Here you will visit Sabal Tsho Lake and take an acclimatization hike to a large cairn at (5271m) on the bank of Kusum Kanguru peak (6367m). Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 9** : Trek from Thangnak to Khare (5045m/16,551ft.)3 hrs. Tea house accommodation. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 10** : Trek from Khare to Mera La (Pass) (5350m/17,542ft.) 5 hrs, Camping accommodation. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 11** : Trek from Mera La to Seto Pokhari Camp (4850m/15,912ft)5hrs. Camping accommodation. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 12** : Trek from Seto Pokhari to Baruntse Base Camp (5300m/17,400ft.)Prepare base camp. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 13 - 27** : Climbing period (7129m)
- **Day 28** : Clean up base camp)Trek to Seto Pokhari (4850m/15,912ft) 6 hrs. Camping accommodation. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 29** : Trek from Seto Pokhari to Mera La (5350m/17,542ft.) 6 hrs.Camping accommodation. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 30** : Trek from Mera la to Kothe(3600m/11,811ft) 5 hrs. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 31** : Trek from Kothe to Thuli Kharka(3900m/12,597ft) 5hrs. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 32** : Thuli Kharka to Lukla(2800m/9,186ft) via Zatrwa La Pass(4610m/15,125ft) 9 hrs. This is your last evening in the mountains.It would be an ideal opportunity for a farewell party with our staff. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 33** : Fly from Lukla to Kathmandu (1350m/4,430ft) 35 mins.Transfer to hotel. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 34** : Final Departure

NOTE: To provide you service in reasonable cost and attempt to address your each requirement **Xtreme Climbers** desired to provide you with some information which directly affects the cost and also helps us breakdown the cost. That is why we have decided to clarify our customers that due to the following reasons mentioned below we have not included the cost of each package in the company website.

Climbing season: The climbing permit royalty cost for mountain will be different during Spring and Autumn season. Normally most of the climbers climb Himalayas in the Spring season. Climbing permit during Autumn will be 50% less than the spring season.

2. The cost of the trip depends on Number of persons joining in group for High expedition or Mountain Climbing including number of climbers, non-climber, base camp supporters, medical doctors, The number of climbing Sherpa guides, high altitude porters, kitchen crew, mode of transport you prefer and many other factors can affect the cost of the trip. Alpine climbing guide as well as the category of the hotel accommodation and the facilities that you aspire in the mountains affect the cost.
3. We operate the High Expeditions, Peak Climbing in full arrangement package and basic arrangement service (full board or base camp service) which directly affects the expedition cost.
4. Request numbers of oxygen, mask regulators and the brands the clients require
5. The itinerary may be changed after reaching an understanding between the agency and the client. Other activities could be added or reduced as per the client's request before processing the trip. Price for reduced activities could be deducted and additional activities could be added in mutual understanding.
