



Kanchenjunga Base Camp Trek



Introduction

Kanchenjunga (8,586 m), the world's third highest mountain, forms Nepal's eastern border with India's Sikkim. In Tibetan, the name Kanchenjunga or "Kang-chen-zod-nga", means "five great treasures of snow" precious i.e. Gold, Silver, Precious Stones, Grain, and Holy Scriptures. Since the locals worship the mountain, there is a tradition among mountaineers not to stand on the actual summit. All successful climbs have stopped just short of the summit honoring an old promise made by the leader of the first successful attempt in 1955 to the Maharaja of Sikkim. This trek is one of the great Himalayan trails, which covers the eastern part of Nepal. The term "Kanchenjunga" stands for crystal clear in Nepali. Kanchenjunga. Being situated in North-East Nepal and is bordered by Sikkim, India. Since the mountain partly lies in Nepal and partly in India, the view of Kanchenjunga can be seen from India, Bhutan, and Tibet.

The trek described below is a circuit and includes a visit to the Pathibara Temple, which is an important religious site for many Indian and Nepali pilgrims. The trail goes northwards to Ghumsa where it climbs to the Kanchenjunga Base Camp (5143 m) going through a spectacular high alpine landscape. It then goes east via 2 passes and continues to the Yalung Base Camp (4500 m), after which it goes back south to Taplejung, the starting and ending point of the trek. The trek goes through the Kanchenjunga Conservation Area, managed by local communities in partnership with WWF, which is one of the least densely populated areas in Nepal. Pristine forests, alpine meadows and high-altitude wetlands are home to the endangered snow leopard and red panda, the vulnerable Himalayan black bear, clouded leopard and Assamese macaque.

- **Day 1** : Arrive at Tribhuvan International Airport (KTM) Kathmandu
- **Day 2** : Flight Kathmandu to Bhadrapur — Drive to Ilam. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 3** : Drive from Ilam to Taplejung (6 - 7 hours). (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 4** : Trek from Taplejung to Mitlung (921 m) 5-6 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 5** : Trek from Mitlung to Chiruwa (1270 m) 5-6 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 6** : Trek from Chiruwa to Sukathum (1579 m) 5 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 7** : Trek from Sukathum to Amjilosa (2308 m) 6 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 8** : Trek from Amjilosa to Gyabla (2730 m) 5-6 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 9** : Trek from Gyabla to Ghunsa (3595 m) 5-6 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 10** : Acclimatization day. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 11** : Trek from Ghunsa to Khangpachen (4050 m) 6-7 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)

- **Day 13** : Trek from Lhonak to Kanchenjunga Base Camp (5143 m) 3 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 14** : Trek from KBC to Ghunsa (3595 m) 8 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 15** : Trek from Ghunsa to High Camp (4,100 m) 5 Hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 16** : Trek from High Camp to Tseram (3870 m) via Sele La Pass - 7-8 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 17** : Trek from Tseram to Namche (3440 m) 6 - 7 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 18** : Explore to Yalung Base Camp (3440 m) 6 — 7 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 19** : Trek from Ramche to Anda Phedi (2800 m) 5 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 20** : Trek from Anda Phedi to Tortong (2400 m) 4 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 21** : Trek from Tortong to Yamphudim (2080 m) 5 - 6 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 22** : Trek from Yamphudim to Khebang (1945 m) 5-6 hours. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 23** : Trek from Khebang to Khanidingbe. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 24** : Drive Khanidingbe to Birtamod by jeep. Overnight in Birtamod. (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner Included)
- **Day 25** : Morning drive to Bhadrapur airport and flight back to Kathmandu. (Breakfast and Dinner Included)
- **Day 26** : Final departure to the international airport. (Breakfast Included)

NOTE: To provide you service in reasonable cost and attempt to address your each requirement **Xtreme Climbers** desired to provide you with some information which directly affects the cost and also helps us breakdown the cost. That is why we have decided to clarify our customers that due to the following reasons mentioned below we have not included the cost of each package in the company website.

1. Climbing season: The climbing permit royalty cost for mountain will be different during Spring and Autumn season. Normally most of the climbers climbs Himalayas in the Spring season. Climbing permit during Autumn will be 50% less than the spring season.
2. The cost of the trip depends on Number of persons joining in group for High expedition or Mountain Climbing including number of climbers, porter, base camp supporters, medical doctors, The number of climbing Sherpa guides, high altitude porter, support crew, mode of transport you prefer and many other factors can affect the cost of the trip. Alpine climbing as well as the category of the hotel accommodation and the facilities that you aspire in the mountains affect the cost.
3. We operate the High Expeditions, Peak Climbing in full arrangement package and basic arrangement service (full board or base camp service) which directly affects the expedition cost.
4. Request numbers of oxygen, mask regulators and the brands the clients require
