



Everest Expedition (North)



Introduction

Mt. Everest North Expedition from Tibet side has become more popular among the mountaineers to make their dream come true to stand on the summit of Mt. Everest (Chomolungma, Goddess Mother of the World). Climbing from the North side or the North Col is twice accessible than the southern side because the climbers do not have to face the notorious Khumbu Ice Falls which time consuming, as the northern side of Mt. Everest is more popular among the mountaineers not because of its world's highest altitude only but also the Himalaya is younger than American and European mountain range the Andes, the Alps and the Rockies. The Everest north ridge expedition is technically more straightforward than the south ridge, at present since last 10 years one can drive all the way to its base camp and can take Yaks all the way to Advance Base Camp or Camp III at 6,500 meters which makes it affordable cost of royalty and other mountaineering services has made the north Col more popular than the south ridge. Xtreme Climbers Treks and expedition offers a full service expedition of this world renowned peak with a medium number of climbers and a 1:1 climbing Sherpa/Guide to each of our valuable climber. We are committed to providing the highest level of support with technically strong and highly experienced, climbing Sherpa Guide (Many Times Everest Summitters South/North both side) support and the best high end gear. There are no easy routes on Everest but we try to put the odds on our side. We take the North Ridge because we consider it to be the safest. Technically, it is more challenging than the South Side but does not have the ice fall danger. Our Advanced Base Camp (6,400 m.) is right under the shadow of Changtse and has a view of virtually the whole route. From here we use four more camps, a formula that has brought us considerable success in the past.

Our trip starts driving from Kathmandu to Kerung (Rasuwa District) or flight in to Lhasa (Additional Cost required). We will

have 2/3 days sightseeing around Lhasa then three day drive taken us to the Everest Chinese Base Camp at 5,400m. and from there it is 22 km to the ABC at 6400m by yaks. We put an intermediate camp on the glacier about half way between Base Camp and ABC, so this trip takes two days. From the ABC the route continues up the East Rongbuk glacier to the north of the glacier and then up easy snow slopes to the North Col at 7,000m.

- **Day 17 - 37** : Everest Climbing period: Camp I (7000m/22965ft), Camp II (7700m/25262ft),Camp III (8300m/27230ft) respectively. Summit on the highest point of the planet. Included meals: High Food.
- **Day 38** : Team members walk to Base Camp. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 39** : Packing of personal equipment at Base Camp. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 40** : Depart Base Camp and drive to Shigatse to spend a night in a hotel. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 41** : Drive from Shigatse to Lhasa. Included meals:Breakfast Lunch Dinner
- **Day 42** : Fly from Lhasa to Kathmandu: Includes meals: Breakfast Dinner

We provide UHF/VHF hand held radios on the mountain to maintain communications between ABC and high camps. We provide a personal climbing Sherpa guide to help the clients reach the summit. The secret of success on Everest is a strong and experienced climbing Sherpa. No matter how good and experienced the climber, it is a long slog. Personal climbing Sherpas will set up camp 1, camp 2 and camp 3. They will also carry food provisions, fuel and oxygen and will guide and assist the client on the summit day.



Cost and payment details

The cost is depending on group size, affected due to the requirement of number of guides and porters, requisite of Hotel in Kathmandu, method of land/air transport. The itinerary is changeable and modifiable as per needs and time frame of trekkers. Cost will be re calculated if the itinerary is changed or modified. Why we dont't include cost in our website?

NOTE: To provide you service in reasonable cost and attempt to address your each requirement **Xtreme Climbers** desired to provide you with some information which directly affects the cost and also helps us breakdown the cost. That is why we have decided to clarify our customers that due to the following reasons mentioned below we have not included the cost of each package in the company website.

1. Climbing season: The climbing permit royalty cost for mountain will be different during Spring and Autumn season. Normally most of the climbers climbs Himalayas in the Spring season. Climbing permit during Autumn will be 50% less than the spring season.
2. The cost of the trip depends on Number of persons joining in group for High expedition or Mountain Climbing including number of climbers, non-climber, base camp supporters, medical doctors, The number of climbing Sherpa guides, high altitude porters, kitchen crew, mode of transport you prefer and many other factors can affect the cost of the trip. Alpine climbing guide as well as the category of the hotel accommodation and the facilities that you aspire in the mountains affect the cost.
3. We operate the High Expeditions, Peak Climbing in full arrangement package and basic arrangement service (full board or base camp service) which directly affects the expedition cost.
4. Request numbers of oxygen, mask regulators and the brands the clients require
5. The itinerary may be changed after reaching an understanding between the agency and the client. Other activities could be added or reduced as per the client's request before processing the trip. Price for reduced activities could be deducted and additional activities could be added in mutual understanding.
6. Either you want to operate this expedition as international group joining basics of Xtreme Climbers or individual (private arrangement) expedition.
7. Type of high camp food that you require. Any specialized food that has to be ordered from foreign countries will be costlier compared to the local food here.
